The report examines effective governance mechanisms for the energy transition with a specific view to cross-sectoral interfaces with other Alpine-relevant topics such as water, tourism, spatial planning, mountain agriculture, and financing. It offers insights into managing and leading collaborative energy governance and highlights the crosscutting nature of the energy transition, urging a rethink of governance frameworks to tackle emerging challenges.

Join us to hear about the lessons learned from our Energy Governance report and discuss follow-up activities for the Alpine Climate Board. This webinar will showcase pilot projects that tackle the interfaces between energy and other sectors and provide an opportunity for networking with related stakeholders.
